- 1. Aligning HUD's definition of homelessness with those of federal programs for children, youth, and families.
- 2. Requiring HUD to score applications primarily on whether they are cost-effective in meeting the priorities and goals that communities identify in their local plans.
- 3. Improving HUD homeless assistance data and transparency.

This legislation would give local communities the flexibility to provide assistance to homeless children, youth, and families in a way that is responsive to the unique needs of each community.
