Timing for Congressional Action?

- **†** Proposed reconciliation timeline from Speaker Johnson:
- Week of Feb. 10: House Budget Committee approves a budget resolution, followed by a House floor vote
- mek of Feb. 17: Senate vote-a-rama to adopt a budget resolution
- A week to negotiate a bicameral resolution that serves as a compromise between the House and Senate plans
- Feb 27: Final vote to adopt a concurrent budget resolution backed by Republicans in both chambers

Not done yet

- By Easter: Pass a reconciliation package in the House floor
- By Memorial Day: Final passage



What's Next? Reconciling House and Senate Budget

Questions Remain:

- Senate and House must pass SAME budget resolution -
- so, one "Big, Beautiful Bill" or two packages?

HOUSE:

- Consolidated Approach -
- \$4.5 Trillion in Cuts being Sought -
- \$880 Billion specifically targeted at Health
 - Medicaid



SENATE:

- 2-Phase Approach
- Starting with \$2
 Billion Target as a
 Floor



Risks to Medicaid

From Modern Healthcare – 1/22/25 Murphy emphasized that Congress should still carefully look at ways to save money on Medicaid. That includes enforcing <u>eligibility</u> <u>standards</u>, perhaps changing <u>funding formulas</u>, possibly going to block grants and certainly looking at making the program more efficient, he said. -Rep. Dr. Greg Murphy (R-NC)

What has surfaced in Majority Plans in Congress thus far?

Converting Medicaid from open-ended entitlement financing to <u>"per capita" funding</u>, which would reduce federal support by \$900 billion over 10 years.

Eliminating enhanced federal payments to states that expanded Medicaid under the ACA, which would cut the program by \$561 billion.

Establishing work requirements for Medicaid, which would reduce spending by \$100 billion.

Restricting states from using <u>provider taxes</u> and <u>state-directed payments</u> to coax higher federal Medicaid funding, which would save about \$200 billion.
