2024 GOALS AND OUTCOMES

GROW

- Build partnerships to improve outcomes for people with disabilities
 - ✓ Focused first on Mental Health Link Center presenting at this Winter Meeting
 - ✓ LSA Disability Network grew to 17 members representing 33 states

CATALYZE

- Offer a **portal** for services/organization tools
 - ✓ Met with vendors, like non-profit organizations, survey member needs
 - ✓ Investing in a Collaborative Learning Platform
 - ✓ Pilot with the platform first with the Disability Network in early June

AMPLIFY

- Develop a data agenda that identifies efficiencies that align with impact
 - ✓ Formed committee explored DN history of shared data and learned from initial conversations with Robert Wood Johnson on the design of a Shared Data Model
- Work towards targeted position statements that drive the narrative & solutions on what is important to the Disability Network
 - ✓ Network members met with nearly 20 key lawmakers and their staff, including members of the Senate Finance Committee and the House Ways and Means subcommittee on Social Security.
